## Confirmation is Expanding!!

The last couple of years, Holy Shepherd, Lutheran Church of the Master, Atonement and Centennial Lutheran Church have teamed up together to offer confirmation classes. During this time, we have invited parents to participate with their child's confirmation class time. Every year we consistently receive feedback from the adults, that they either loved the refresher of their confirmation experience or they never personally had a confirmation class experience and they really appreciated this learning experience. So... we are expanding our confirmation experience.

In addition to our traditional, middle school aged students, ALL ARE INVITED to attend confirmation classes! We encourage parents, grandparents, siblings, and other church members to participate in confirmation this year. If you have felt the tug to learn more about God, faith, the Bible or what it means to be a Lutheran, YOU are invited. Centennial Lutheran Church will host the first class on **Wednesday, September 12 at 6 pm** and our dinner will be **POTLUCK**.

### What/So What?

On the **first Wednesday night of the month** (with some variance for holidays and school schedules, like our first scheduled class) our congregations will gather together for confirmation class. This is a two-year cycled program with one year focused on Bible and one on our Lutheran tradition. After the completion of a two-year cycle, participants may choose to affirm their baptism, which is the technical term for "confirmation".

Our Wednesday night schedule is:

- 6 pm:** Dinner and learning "**What?**" a specific part of our faith might be: baptism, communion, prayer, Bible, etc.
- 6:30 pm:** Presentation focusing on the "**So what?**" Why does this part of faith matter for us?
- 7 pm:** Small Groups (age based) discussion led by pastors/other leaders.
- 7:30 pm:** Large Group prayer and dismissal

### Now What?

Once a month we will also recommend an additional activity helping us to think about "**Now what?**" Now what does our faith move us to do? This may be a service project with the whole group, a presentation, or something to do on your own. More information on these events will be available throughout the year. If you have a suggestion for an activity, please share!

So, there you have it. In addition to the traditional confirmation students, Confirmation is being expanded to EVERYONE. Please contact Pastor Michael with your desire to participate.

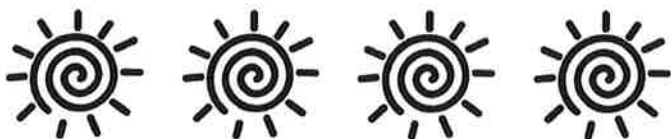
We gather as broken people dependent on God's healing and life giving presence in our lives.

## News from the Busy Bees

Through the end of July, we have completed 62 quilts!

Thanks to Doris Frick who makes quilts at home and brings at least one and sometimes two completed quilts to each meeting. Marie Szaltzer, Sandee Reynebeau and Sharyl Wills sew quilt tops and bottoms at home and bring them to the meetings--ready to assemble as quilts. All of these ladies use fabric that has been donated to Busy Bees. We have some very nice looking quilts.

We have received many donations of quilting fabric--from Holy Shepherd members and families, our Busy Bees members donate from their own quilting stash, members of the Embroiderer's Guild donate quilting fabrics, and Scholastic books donated several boxes of fabric that was used to decorate school book fairs; and others who anonymously drop off bags of fabric. We are so thankful that the message is out there that the fabric is for a caring and loving cause. It takes about 9 yards of fabric for each quilt. The Lutheran World Relief requires each quilt be 60" X 80".

One member, Sharyl, goes to many garage sales and at one recent trip she found some sheets--some of them were never used and still in the wrappers others were like new--.50 each. She got 20 sheets. The sheets are perfect for quilt backing--no piecing--ready to use. When the seller found out what they were for she was happy they were going to a good cause.

We have eight regular members and three or more who come when they can. All are welcome to come join us.

Don and Emily Johnson deliver the quilts to Urban Servant Corps. We are so thankful for their help.

## Ministry Focus: *Educate, Equip, Enact (3E)*

### Thoughts from Bishop Jim:

**Educate, Equip, Enact (3E)** is a unique collaborative ministry with the potential to transform our relationship with money as people of faith! Thanks to the grace and vision of Lilly Endowment, our synod is able to offer our congregations stewardship training while assisting our pastors and deacons with economic challenges and opportunities that enhance generosity. The overall goal is nothing less than building a new culture around finances that unleashes our full potential as Christ's Church for the life of the world.

### Mission Moment

**Educate, Equip, Enact (3E)**, the Rocky Mountain Synod's three-year, \$500,000 Lilly Endowment grant continues to gain momentum! So far in 2018, 61 rostered ministers have entered the process to receive grants through 3E's **Ministerial Excellence Fund (MEF)**, helping alleviate education, credit card, or medical debt and insufficient retirement savings or supplement continuing education – thus increasing their capacity for healthy ministry. In 2017 we awarded \$25,000 in grants and through July of 2018, we have awarded **\$151,510 – over a 500% increase** in grant awards! Pastors and deacons tell us that through **MEF** grants they are experiencing grace and have renewed capacity to face financial challenges.

The **Ministerial Excellence Fund** is designed to create partnership and *cannot operate without your generosity*. The Lilly grant is structured so that in order to release \$1 of Lilly grant money, \$1 of a matching gift is needed. That means that of the \$150,000 shared this year, \$75,000 came from contributions from members of the Rocky Mountain Synod! So, we thank you for this tremendous generosity

We thank you for helping keep the **3E** momentum going! Our goal is nothing less than the complete transformation of the Rocky Mountain Synod's culture around money. We are recipients of God's abundance *for the sake of the world*. And, we are on this road together, on the way in God's freeing grace toward greater generosity and financial health in Christ.

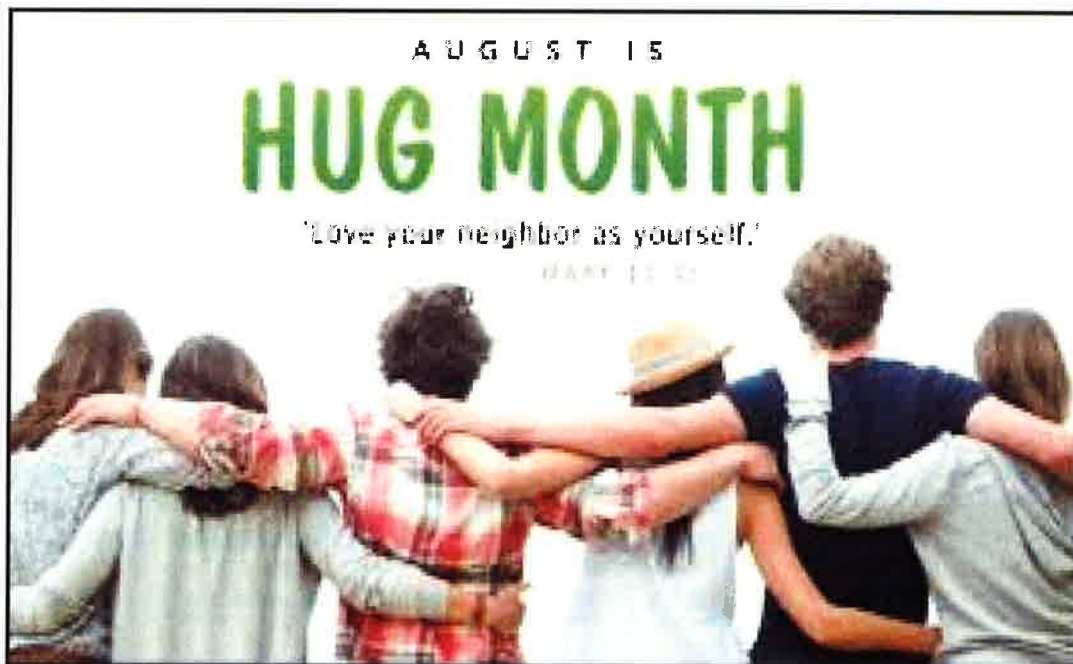
