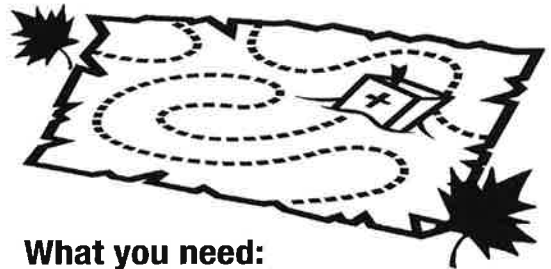

We are in good standing with State and Federal regulations.

### *HVAC Replacement Up-date*

In August and September, Peter Morse and the Property Team worked hard to get bids and congregational approval for replacement of the HVAC unit that brings heat and cooling to the Sanctuary. On September 10 the Congregation voted to approve the contract with Excel Mechanical to replace the 35 ton unit.

We now have signed a bid for \$73,000. The installation is expected to begin November 5.

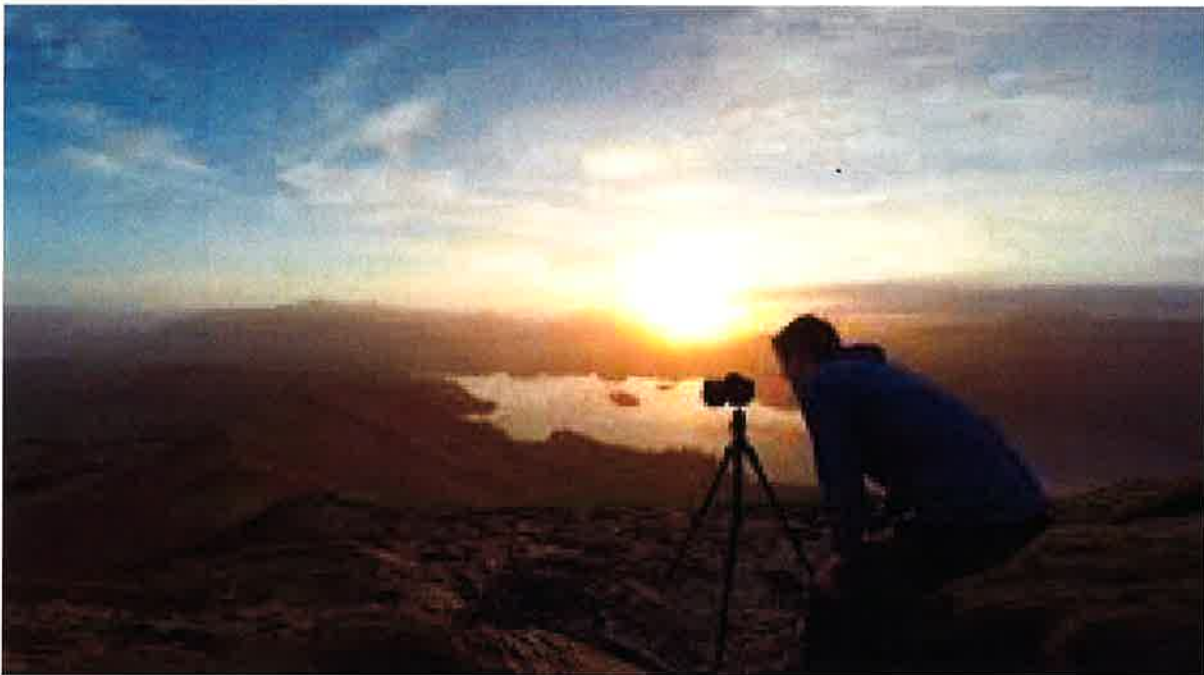
