Brilliant, they won't be expecting that!

I've been reminded, quite frequently lately, of the powerful phrase, "Brilliant! They won't be expecting that!" In the Christmas video, time and time again, God shares how God plans to enter into the mess people are making and each time the response is, "Brilliant! They won't be expecting that!" "Will you send an army, powerful and royal people and in a palace?... Nope, a new born baby, born to a humble servant, born in a stable and food trough for animals... Brilliant! They won't be expecting that... Who will you first share the news with?... Lowly, pushed to the edges, stinky shepherds... Brilliant! They won't be expecting that."

I'd like to throw out this assumption, "God is still at it: Showing up and acting in the world in unexpected ways." No, "Brilliant, unexpected ways." If so, I for one, want to be a part of it. How about you?

When I was a little boy, I often imagined what it would have been like to be present in that first Christmas. I would imagine being at the stable with all its sounds, sights, and smells. And, I would imagine being out on the edge of town, in the dark, with sheep, shepherds and a sky filled with angels. I loved entering into the story and it left me filled with wonder, awe and joy.

What about today? Reflecting on God's brilliant ways of showing up in the past, where might we expect the unexpected God? What would it be like, TODAY, to enter into what God is doing in and for the world? Where do we need to go to find this unexpected God? Where do we look today: church buildings, worship, devotional time? To be honest, I've experienced God in these places many times in the past. In fact, I've grown to expect God to show up there. AND, maybe, just maybe, by focusing on the expected places God shows up, we close ourselves off from the unexpected and BRILLIANT ways God is showing up today.

Yes, God will continue to show up as we gather as God's children, in bread and wine and in water because God promises this. AND where else? Will we be open to God's brilliance and step into the new and unexpected ways God is active in the world?

And let me conclude by throwing this out there also. When we do open ourselves to the new and unexpected ways God is showing up in the world, we will again be filled with wonder, awe and with God's help, JOY!

MASON JAR nightLIGHT

Because Jesus is the light of the world, his followers don't need to fear darkness or life's dark times. Make this nightlight to remind you of Jesus' light and presence.



What you need:

- Work area with good ventilation
- Mason jar
- Clear glue that works on glass
- Paintbrush
- Glass stones
- Tealight candle
- Lighter
- Adult supervision

What you do:

1. Starting at the top of the jar, brush glue on a small section.
2. Press glass stones onto the glue in rows. Let dry.
3. Continue gluing stones, in small sections, until the entire jar is covered.
4. When dry, place a candle inside. Light with adult help.

Mission Moment: *International Women Leaders Initiative*



Faye Lee is beginning her junior year at Luther College through the ELCA’s International Women Leaders initiative, a project of Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA. Faye is double-majoring in political science and international studies and aspires to work with the United Nations. She represents her home church, the Lutheran Church in Malaysia, which she will serve after graduating. During the summer of 2018, Faye worked as an intern with ELCA Global Church Sponsorship, helping to tell the story of the ELCA’s work alongside global companions, including the International Women Leaders initiative.

“I didn’t understand at the beginning how important this ministry is to the church and to society and how much effort is expended to sustain this mission every single day,” says Faye. “The [International Women Leaders] program has shaped me to be an ally of feminism and gender-justice movements. Being comfortable with uncomfortable issues that face women all over the world today has been one of the key empowering breakthroughs I have experienced through the program.”

This critical initiative for women is thriving, thanks in large part to the faithful partnership of our ELCA colleges and universities. Educational partners now include: Augsburg University, California Lutheran University, Concordia College, Lenoir-Rhyne University, Luther College, Newberry College, St. Olaf College, Wartburg College, and Wittenberg University. We also depend on the program’s partnership with the ELCA global companion churches that have raised up these 15 scholars and who will welcome them back after graduation.
