Submissions will be collected by Karen Novess. Your submission does not need to be framed or even sized – I will take your “art piece” and prepare it for the art gallery.

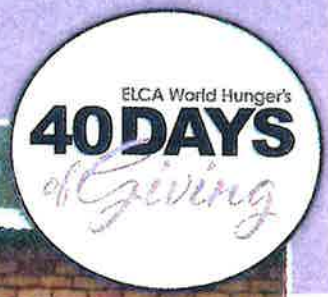

Malawi



The hope for sufficient livelihood that could provide for her family inspired Mrs. Kamela to join a village savings and loan group through Evangelical Lutheran Development Service (ELDS), which is supported by ELCA World Hunger.
