It's been quite a year, traveling to and around the USA for a total of 3 months, having to relocate to South Africa for 3 weeks with all 10 YAGM volunteers because of the plague and all the ongoing and typical challenges and opportunities of life as a YAGM Country Coordinator in Madagascar. I was and am so thankful for all of it. And it was pretty tiring. So I took some time to unwind and refresh at the end of the year. I jumped over to Mauritius for a few days, absolutely wonderful. It was a perfectly Malagasy affair, with speech after speech, multiple presentations, reflections on their history and the themes that LWF (Lutheran World Federation) created, awards and pins given, songs sung, worship, congratulations, appreciation, a long communion, greetings of friends and kind words spoken and gracious hospitality shared.

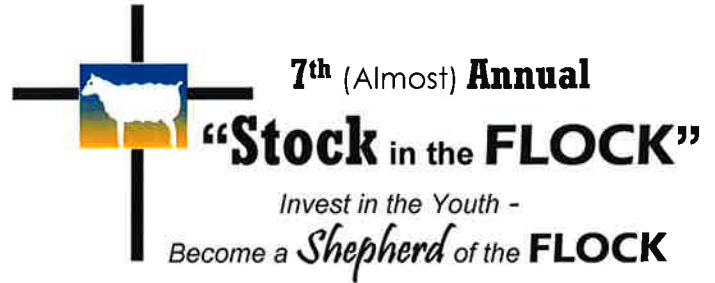
