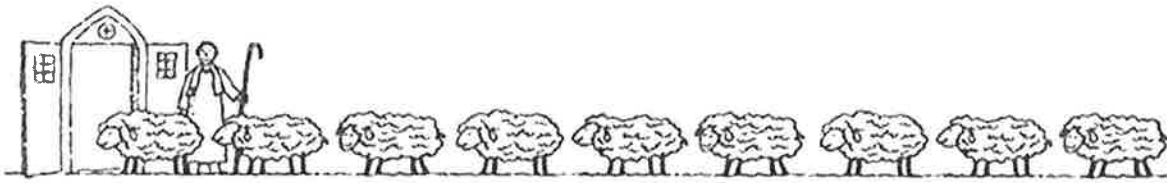

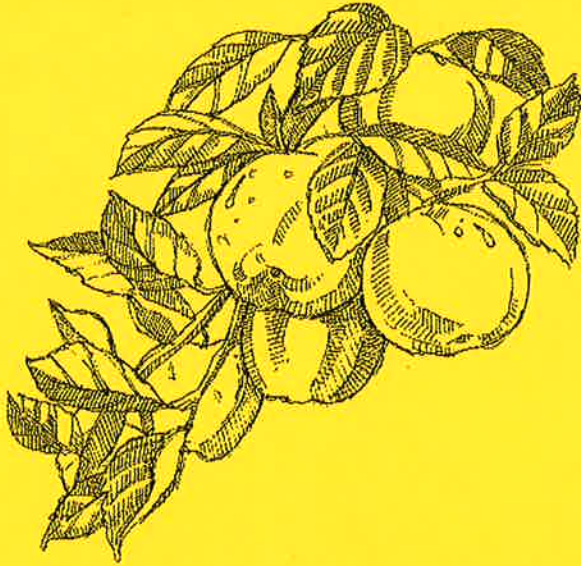

Lutheran Family Services Rocky Mountain

Lutheran Family Services Rocky Mountain has been serving communities for 70 years. There are Regional Centers in Metro Denver, Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado Springs, Ft. Morgan, South Colorado, and Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Their programs include: Adoption, Pregnancy Counseling, Foster Care, Prevention Services, Refugee and Asylee, and Older Adults and Caregiver Services. The following explains the mission and the services offered in the different areas of need.

Adoption: Since 1948, our mission is to offer services that strengthen, heal and provide hope for individuals and families. We help to build families through infant, designated, and international adoption by providing support, education, and counseling. As a full service Colorado adoption agency, our adoption and pregnancy counselors work closely with clients as they consider and prepare for adoptive parenthood. We are committed to serving children and families regardless of race, ethnicity, religion or sexual orientation. We have offices in Denver, Fort Collins and Colorado Springs serving the Front Range.

The adoption process can be overwhelming and confusing, but we can help! Whether you are looking to adopt, you're working with an expectant mother or you want to search for your birth relatives, our counselors will work with you throughout your journey.

Foster Care: At LFS, we believe there is no such thing as "other people's kids." Through our Foster Care Program, we work diligently with our families to support them through the foster process and beyond. We provide skilled, caring substitute families for children unable to live with their birth families. Most children in foster care have been abused or neglected. Foster families provide children in foster care with a safe, nurturing home. In addition, they work with LFS staff to address each child's individual needs. We provide the support; you provide a stable home, structure, and love. Lutheran Family Services can also assist with kinship adoptions.

You can help by becoming a foster parent! Lutheran Family Services is looking for safe, nurturing homes for children in need. We especially need parents who are willing to foster: children over the age of 8, sibling groups of two or more, or children with medical or behavioral issues. By opening your heart and your home, you can restore hope for a child in foster care as they wait to reunite with their family or to join a new family through adoption.

Prevention Services: Mission: To help break the multigenerational cycle of child abuse and family violence through parenting education and support.

The Parenting Education and Support program offers a number of different classes in Larimer and Weld Counties that teach parents; empathy, loving discipline, normal child development, how to be there for your child, how to listen and reason and how to take time for yourself when you are stressed.

The SafeCare Colorado program offers in-home, voluntary services that support families in gaining skills to provide a safe home, address child health needs, and engage in positive interactions with their children ages five and under.

The SafeTouch program is presented to children ages 5-12 in Weld County schools and concentrates on how children and adolescents can protect themselves from any type of abusive or unwanted touch. The program devotes time to the problems associated with abusive situations among family members, acquaintances, strangers and peers – empowering children and adolescents to seek help if threatened or victimized.

Older Adult & Caregiver Services (OACS): OACS provides senior care management to older adults, their families, and caregivers. Through counseling, care management, and caregiver support, our OACS experts assist you with concerns and decisions regarding aging. After reviewing a patient's current environment including medical and mental health conditions, support systems, financial circumstances, etc., our care managers will create a personalized plan based on the client's unique needs. This plan will offer solutions through community resources and other services and may require additional assistance for ongoing needs. Care managers can help with these ongoing needs until the plan is completed. Care Management is provided at an hourly rate, a sliding fee scale structure may be available based on the older adult's income. African American Caregiver Support is provided also. Care Management is offered in the Denver Metro areas.

Refugees & Asylee: **Refugees** are individuals who are forced to flee their countries of origin because of a well-founded fear of persecution due to race, religion, nationality, or membership in a particular social or political group. **Asylees** are people already in the United States who receive protected status and are unable to return home for the same reasons that refugees are unable to return home.

Since 1975, the LFS Refugee & Asylee Programs have helped people who have been uprooted by persecution and violence work towards self-sufficiency through essential resettlement services, including: housing, employment, English language, and cultural orientation. LFS works together with LIRS, and other churches, organizations, community groups, businesses, and individuals to provide the services and supplies necessary for refugees to become self-sufficient and integrate into their new communities. LFS serves refugees in the Rocky Mountain Region with offices in Denver, Colorado Springs, Greeley/Fort Morgan, and Albuquerque.
