Healthy relationships are the key, not simply being called into relationships, but healthy ones. In the world today, healthy relationships with one another can seem like wishful thinking. There are relationships everywhere in intense divisions with what seems to be ever growing and insurmountable chasms growing between us. And yet, I still feel God calling us into healthy relationships with one another, maybe even, especially, right now. But how?

Over my lifetime, I've learned (and continue to learn), that communication, good, honest, open, faithful communication is one of the critical foundations to healthy relationships. In particular, how we engage in conversations around topics that can be filled with various degrees of tension is critical. As I reflect on the atmosphere of our society, Holy Shepherd's transition time, and other situations in our shared lives, I'm seeing a great opportunity, as a community, to intentionally set out on a journey of learning about and practicing Courageous Conversations.

What would it look like if Holy Shepherd grew a Courageous Conversation Team that was committed to learning, practicing and empowering us to engage in courageous conversations at Holy Shepherd, in our families, with neighbors, at work and beyond? What would it look like if we modeled to the world, that it is not only possible, but critical to the health of our relationships to gather together in times of tension, confusion, or fear and engage in conversations that honored the other, listened respectfully to understand each other, and shared honestly and respectfully. And, we entered these conversations, open to being changed. These are conversations where each is committed to listening carefully, as much as they are committed to sharing their thoughts. These are conversations that are not seeking a winner and a loser, but a common place to share, in honesty, love and respect.

We have been introduced to some of the tools of Courageous Conversations with the generous gifts of Atonement Lutheran in Boulder. They have given us a taste and a glimpse into the possibilities and the transformational power of courageous conversations. My hope is to take this glimpse and grow it into a full-fledged reality, here at Holy Shepherd. I will be seeking to gather interested folks who will dream of what Holy Shepherd's journey into courageous conversations might look like. If the Spirit tugs at your heart on this, PLEASE pay attention to it and let me know.

I truly have felt the Spirit tugging at my heart on this for some time now and I'm excited to see where the Spirit leads us.

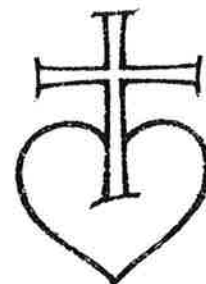
