The Call Committee has invited Rev. Dana Peterson, an ELCA Pastor for over 30 years, a Ministry Coach and Director of Fresh Thinking Strategic Leadership, to facilitate the discussion.

Top Ten Reasons for a Co-Pastor

1. Stronger working relationships are developed through an equal and respectful partnership. When empowered by the congregation, trusted partners can build consensus and resolve conflicts through collaboration.
2. It works in progressive, thriving churches. The Synod is cheering us on. While the model maintains a focus on our self-care, it addresses the need to look beyond of our facility to serve and reach out boldly.
3. Equal responsibility, equal authority and equal emphasis for both the internal and external missions of Holy Shepherd.
4. There is a continued focus on the internal community of Holy Shepherd through pastoral care, spiritual development and worshipping and growing together in Christ.
5. Promotes growth – Service, growth and outreach will have more organizational importance and legitimacy, creating additional opportunities to serve and reach out joyfully to all.
6. Teams can cope with change better through mutual support and responsibility. Equal bearing of the burden and the celebration.
7. Very similar to the way we have done it for the past 14 years but with a more defined allocation of roles and responsibilities.
8. It's not about titles, it is about specific job descriptions and responsibilities.
9. Models the way Christian communities should work.
10. Biblical...disciples went two by two and there's Paul and Silas.

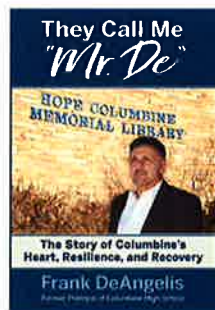

Future benefits will now be tied to your Loyalty Card. This is the card you present for discounts or which you enter your alternate ID. You will now need to associate your Loyalty Card to Holy Shepherd.

Disadvantages: Some of you may have multiple cards for several charities. It appears that this will not be available.

Ministry Focus: *Church Together*

Thoughts from Bishop Jim:

Church Together isn't always easier, but it's faithful to our calling as the Body of Christ for the life of the world. As a church with three distinct but interdependent expressions – congregations, synods, churchwide – our witness and ministry is expanded exponentially by our life as Church Together in local contexts, across this country and around the globe. More than just a good idea, for me Church Together is a lived experience - whether I am with colleagues at our ELCA Conference of Bishops or visiting our synod's congregations and ministries. Church Together is front and center whenever any of us participate in an ELCA Youth Gathering, collaborate with ecumenical/inter-religious partners, engage deeply in our communities or walk with our companions in Madagascar. The list is endless, but the point is singular: there is power and promise when commit ourselves to life as Christ's Church, Better Together!

Mission Moment: *ELCA Conference of Bishops*



The ELCA Conference of Bishops includes all 65 synod bishops of the church together with our Presiding Bishop and ELCA Secretary. This 67-member group gathers at least twice each year for worship and study, mutual sharing and to conduct business. While primarily advisory, the role of the Conference of Bishops is significant within the life of this church, having a particular role in matters related to rostered ministers and also reviewing proposals before they are passed along to the ELCA Church Council for adoption. The conference also advises the Presiding Bishop in matters related to churchwide planning and ecumenical relations. (from ELCA website)

Bishop Jim notes: "In my own experience, the Conference of Bishops represents not only the geographical diversity of our church but the variety of cultural, theological and personal perspectives characteristic of the ELCA itself. The Conference is a community where ideas and joys can be shared, where support and feedback for challenges can be sought, and where future directions for the church's future can be explored. As a community with direct connections to our congregational, synod and churchwide ministries, the Conference of Bishops is well-placed to build bridges of collaboration in our life as Christ's Church, Better Together within the ELCA."
