God showed God's power in amazing, wonderful, and scary ways. The people escaped from Egypt with God's help. The people were so happy to be free. They praised God, dancing and shouting for joy.

"I want my people to remember that I love them, and that they are my people always."

"How can we do that?" Moses asked, curious.

"Every year, have a party to celebrate how I freed you from slavery. Eat special foods that remind you of your amazing escape, and teach all your children that they belong to me."

Moses smiled. "That sounds wonderful!"

To this very day people celebrate this party. It's called Passover.


"PESACH" is another term for Passover. Here are the food items Jewish people eat today for this special meal. Color it up!
